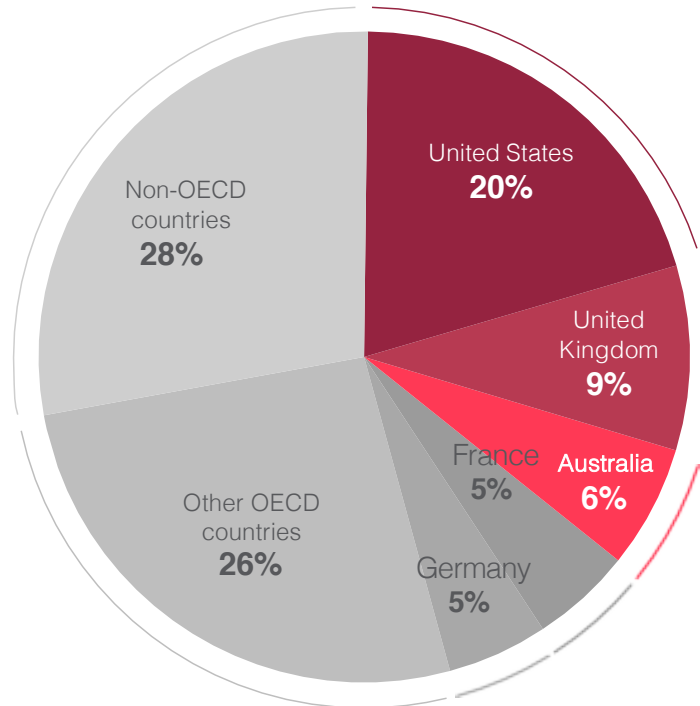

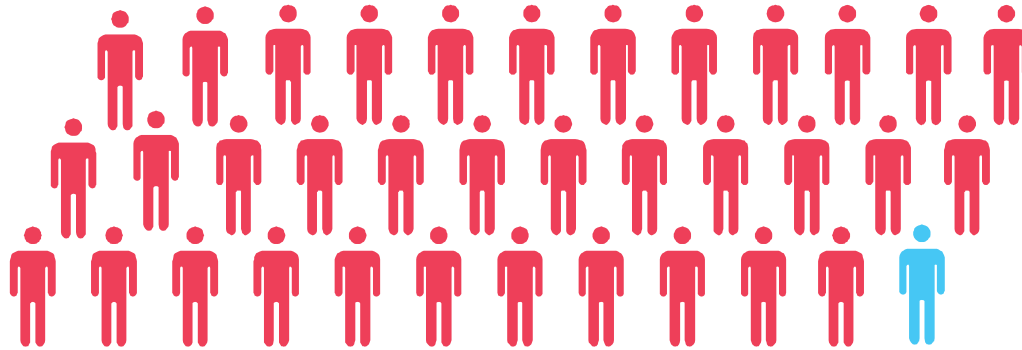
Education at a Glance 2017 (OECD)

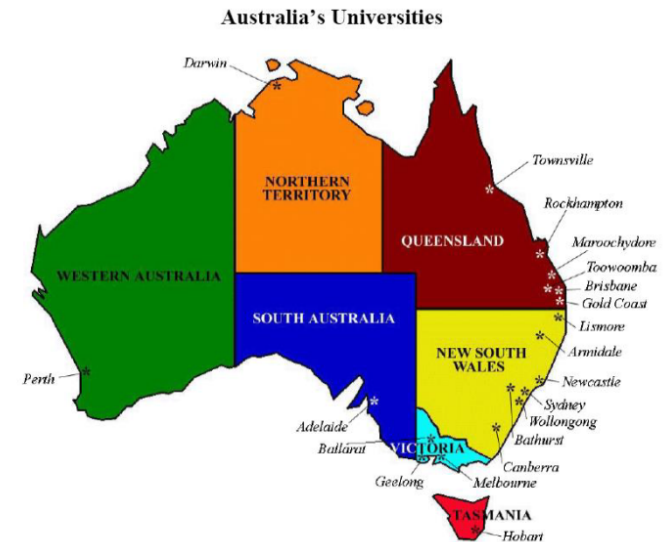

Australian Science and Innovation Achievements

 - Spray on skin

- Australia's vision for economic prosperity, driven by embracing new ideas in industry, science and innovation policy is set out in the National Innovation and Science Agenda (NISA).
- NISA affirms the role of innovation, science and research in powering economic growth.
- \$1.1 billion in initiatives under four pillars over four years.

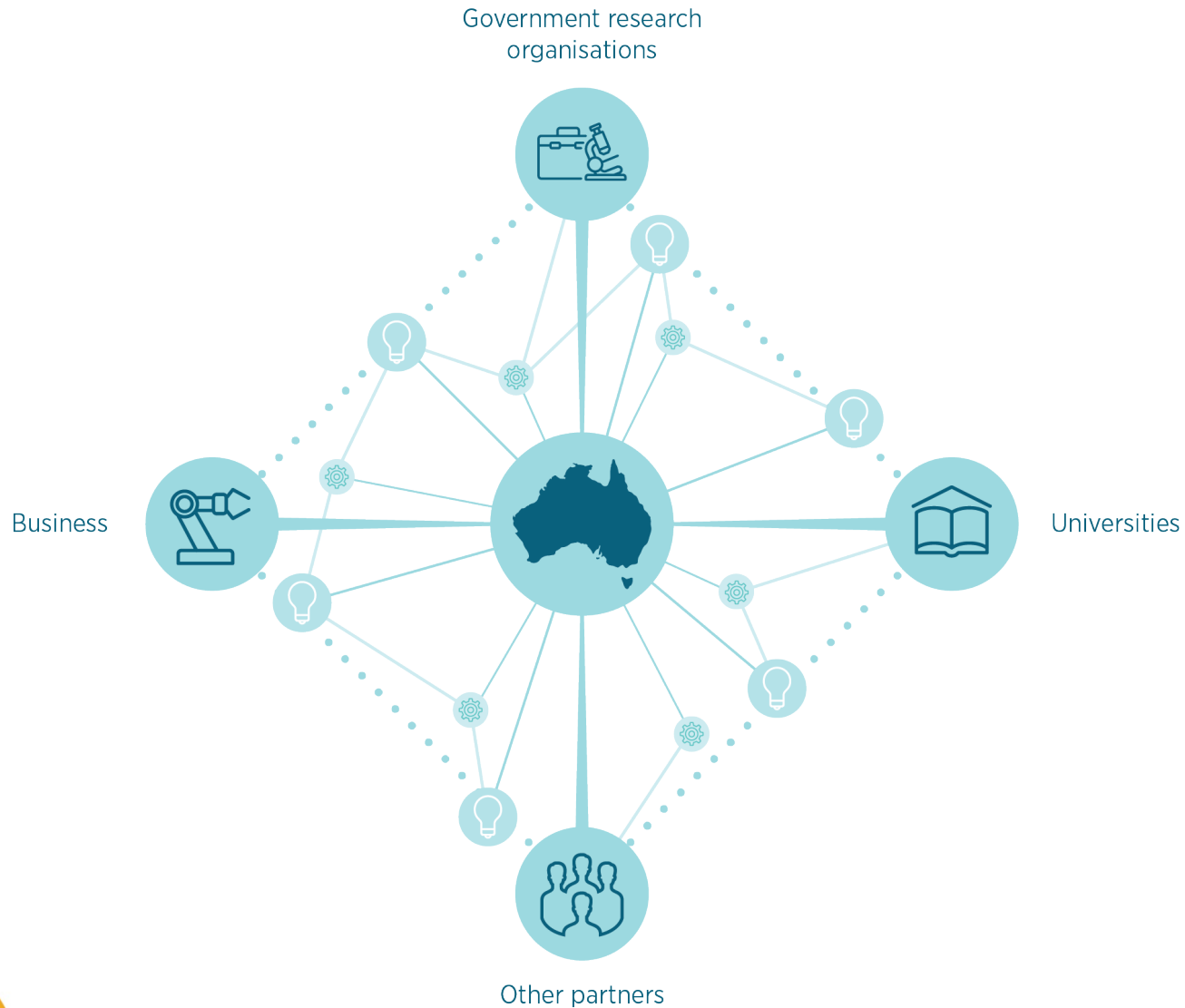

Opportunities for International Collaboration in Science and Research

- Science and Innovation Agenda – Global Innovation Grants
- Australian Research Council Grants – Discovery and Linkage grants for international cooperation
- Partnerships with Australian Universities – all engage with world class research and place high importance on international collaboration

The Australian Research Council

- The ARC is a Commonwealth entity within the Australian Government
 - **provides funding for research** through the competitive funding schemes of the National Competitive Grants Programme (NCGP)
 - **evaluates the quality of research in universities** under the Excellence in Research for Australia (ERA)
- All ARC funding schemes are open to international applicants applying through eligible Australian organisations
- Project funding for travel, including for Overseas Partner Investigators, to support international collaboration
- The ARC does not directly fund or accept applications from individual researchers
- Close to 70% of all funded project involve international collaboration
- ARC Grants Search – search for information on ARC-funded research projects awarded since 2001 (Brazil 205 hits)

 - ATN-South American Scholarships
 - Full research tuition fee scholarship for 3 years
 - Stipend of AUD 31,000 per year
 - Deakin University Latin America Scholarship
 - Worth 15 per cent of total tuition costs of either a Bachelors degree or Masters by coursework

Destination Australia Program

- This new program will support both Australian and international students to study in regional Australia.
- Over 1000 scholarships of \$15,000 will be offered per year to support the study and living expenses associated with studying a Certificate IV to Doctorate level qualification at a regional campus of an eligible tertiary education provider.
- This new scholarship program delivers on the Government's commitment to attract more students – both domestic and international – to study in regional locations.
